

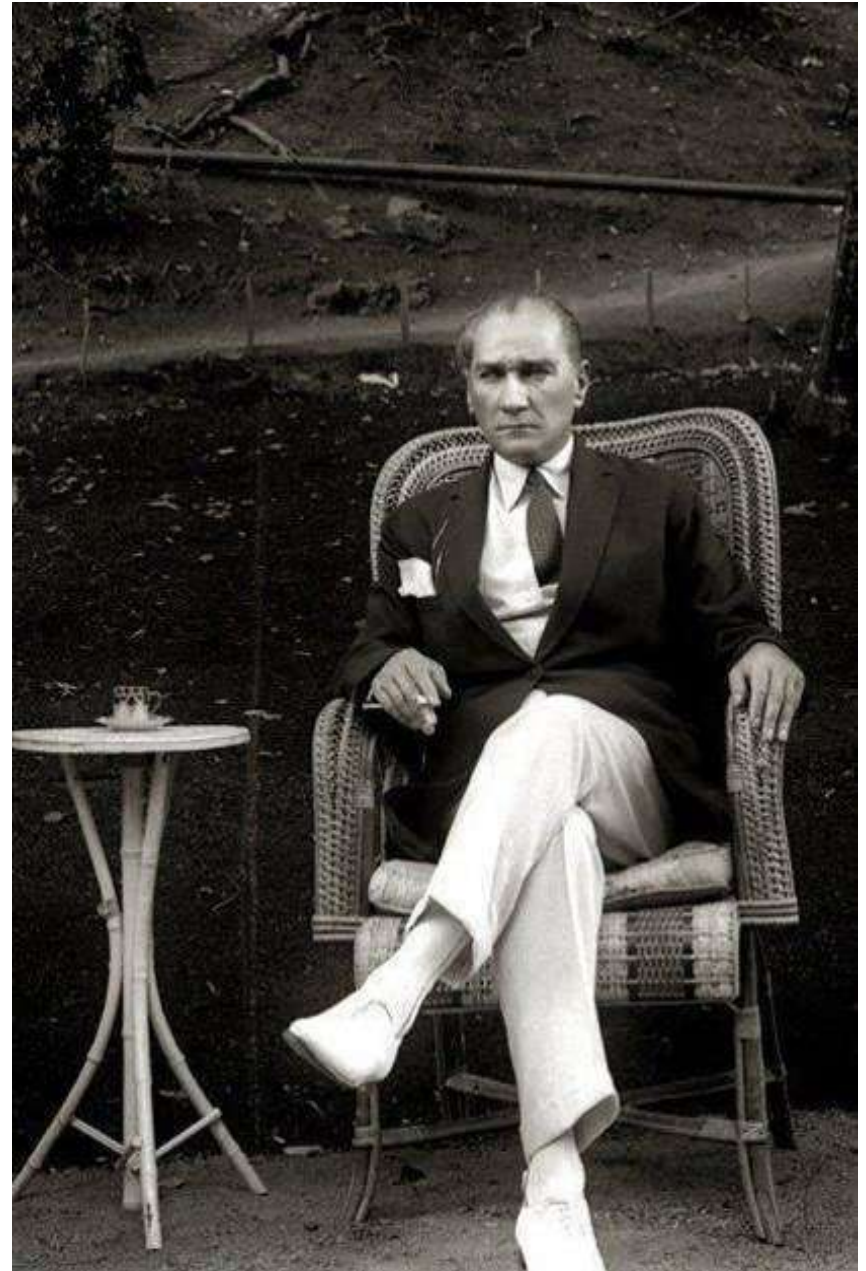


Some Information About Turkey

Must-see Places in Turkey

1-) Pamukkale:

Pamukkale is a hill formed from the lime of spring waters. It is Turkey's best-known natural Wonder and this place welcomes 3 million tourists annually. These waters, which heal many visitors with their thermal waters draw attention with their whiteness.



Must-see Places in Turkey

2-) Cappadocia: “Kappa Tuchia” which means “**The land of beautiful Horses**” is one of the most beautiful holiday centers in Turkey. Cappadocia, which has built a commercial and social bridge between countries throughout history, is also one of the important crossroads of the Silk Road.

3-) Manavgat: Manavgat is the second largest district of Antalya and thousands of tourists come here every year. Tourism is the business line that creates the most employment in the district.

4-) Hagia Sophia

It was built between 532-537 and started to be used as a mosque in 1453. An average of 3 million tourists visit annually.

Before Fatih conquered Istanbul, it was used as a patriarchal cathedral.

5-) Ephesus Ancient City: It used to be a Greek ancient city, now it is located in Izmir, Turkey

The construction of the ancient city of Ephesus dates back to BC and is visited by both foreign and domestic tourists every year.



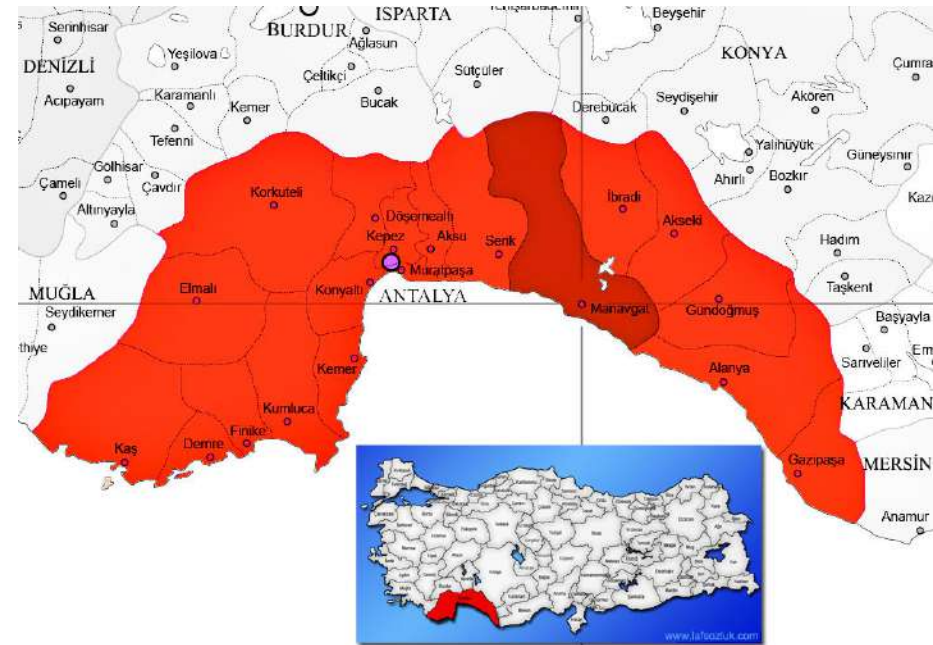
Must-see Places in Turkey
